Youngeun “January” Kim, Communications Director



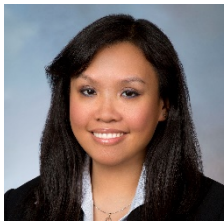

Enoch Chang, Director



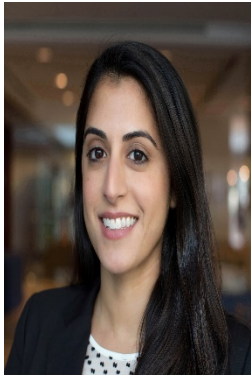
